

Governed by a board of community leaders, The Arts Council continues to faithfully serve as the lead advocate for all arts and culture efforts in Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Leon, Madison, Robertson, and Washington counties by providing innovative and impactful artistic opportunities to residents and visitors of the region.

Art Reaching Teens (A.R.T.) for Life is a hands-on, artist-mentored youth program that provides individuals in juvenile detention and on probation with a foundation for making better life choices, providing a process for personal growth and a positive outlet for creative energy.

## Grants

# College Station / Bryan Annual Program & Marketing

The Arts Council's Annual Marketing and Program Grant program provides affiliate organizations with financial support for projects that make a significant contribution toward promoting the arts, culture, and heritage in the Brazos Valley and directly enhance and promote tourism and the convention and hotel industry.

#### Grants are available to:

- Current Arts Council affiliate groups in good standing
- Affiliates that are not-for-profit under IRS section 501 (c)(3)
- Charted in the state of Texas
- Doing business and presenting programs in College Station, Bryan, and Brazos County

All eligible groups requesting Arts Council Marketing and Program Grant funds are required to comply with the following two-part test:

CRITERIA I: EVERY expenditure must DIRECTLY enhance and promote tourism AND the hotel & convention industry

**CRITERIA II:** Expenditures must fall into one of the following categories:

- **1.** Paying the establishment, improvement, maintenance, or administrative costs for facilitating a convention or registration
- **2.** Paying for advertising, solicitation, and promotional programs that attract tourists and convention delegates to the city or it's vicinity
- **3.** Expenditures that promote the arts
- **4.** Funding historical restoration and preservation projects or activities, advertising, solicitation and promotional programs that encourage tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums
- **5.** Funding costs to hold sporting events that substantially increase hotel activity
- **6.** The enhancement or upgrading of existing sports facilities or sports fields

Annual Marketing and Program Grant funds are available for a wide range of projects. In general they should serve to increase understanding and participation in arts, culture, or heritage programs, be of an educational or instructional function, and directly support or promote the hotel/motel and tourist industries.

# College Station / Bryan Annual Program & Marketing

The Arts Council of Brazos Valley's Navasota Marketing & Program Grant program is funded through the City of Navasota's Hotel Occupancy Tax revenue. # Horlock House

Built in 1892 by Robert Augustus Horock, the gallery has been fully restored to the "Stick" Victorian Style with some Eastlake influence. The house was donated to the Grimes County Heritage Association in 1981 and is currently owned by the City of Navasota.

The Horlock House currently houses the Navasota Artist in Residence program, a collective effort between The Arts Council and the City of Navasota. which gives three artists from around the nation the opportunity to live and create at the Horlock Art Gallery & History Museum. The house features living quarters, studio space, and gallery space, combining to create an unique experience and atmosphere for the artists.

The Arts Council of Brazos Valley is the advocate for arts, heritage, and culture efforts in the seven counties of the Brazos Valley. The Arts Center is the hub of the arts in the Brazos Valley, serving over 60 affiliate groups and hosting over 20,000 visitors annually. To l

## Sarah Gomez



My work centers around the fear of never being seen.

Two years ago I graduated from university and found myself in the brand new city of Dallas.

No connections, no family, no knowledge of the community. Unsure of how to rebuild. I wanted to feel welcomed and safe in discovering Dallas and what it had in store for me.

Before moving, I had my life lines on me at all times. My support circle was only minutes away. My partner, sharing the same bed as me. My closest friend, sleeping on the couch when he would visit for the weekend. Driving home to be with my family within an hour. Not having to count down the days until we are together again. Texts and social media were seen as casual communication, not as the sole form of connection.

Being at home is a moment in time I wish I could freeze and keep forever. It was the first place I felt seen, and I did not want to lose it.

As I grew older, this need for my independence, building a name for myself outside of my home & insistence of pursuing greatness took over. I could conquer the world with only me, myself, and I. Nothing could stop me. Never accounting for the grief I would experience in leaving the only people who ever saw me, and how that heaviness would close me off from finding that connection again. My partner and I are trying to rebuild a home with the pieces we have left. Every trinket, sculpture, toy, and piece of clothing we display in our home tether us back with the people we lost, and the stories of those memories. The objects become as familial as our own bodies. A red jacket reminiscent of the smothering of blankets at my Welas house. Worn socks reminiscent of the stubbornness of our fathers who can not let them go. Patterned carpet reminiscent of a tapestry hung up in my parents house, brought back from deployment. Blue, green, and gold hues of the glowing walls reminiscent of the sunrise in my parents room every day.

I will find new people who see me, and gather them on this journey of growth if they want to come along. Allowing Dallas to become the safe and welcoming space I have always wanted. Slowly grieving the greatest transition of our lives so far, but not letting it stop us from creating new moments of happiness in the process.

Tethering us to this new home.


